After getting dropped for a loss, and a penalty, Chowbay got to the outside for his, and the Bears' first score of the season. The 7-0 score held until the end of the first.

Lebanon went three-and-out again, and Mt. Juliet went back to work. It took four runs, capped off by sophomore Kyle Mahler's 23-yard run, to get the Bears on the board again.

Another Lebanon three-and-out set up a 1-play drive for the Bears, as Contrez McCathern rumbled for a 61-yard score.

Lebanon was able to pick up a first down, but the Bear defense wouldn't allow anymore. The ball went back to Mt. Juliet and big runs by Ben Cheatham and Jalen Graham set up a 23-yard run Hopkins run for another score, which made it 28-0.

Lebanon went three-and-out once again, and Mt. Juliet only needed one play to get back in the end zone.

Chowbay threw his first touchdown as Hopkins streaked down the field uncovered for a 42-yard score. At the half, it was 35-0 Bears.

The accelerated clock ran the entire second half. Graham got things started with a big kickoff return down to the Lebanon 33-yard line. It appeared Mt. Juliet had found the end zone again on a Chowbay to Hopkins pass, but it was called back on a penalty. Ryan Jenkins took care of it, kicking a 43-yard field goal to put the Bears up 38-0.

After another Lebanon three-and-out, Mt. Juliet got its last score of the night. Big runs by Mahler of 25 and 18 set up Cheatham runs of eight and a touchdown of 14 yards. The extra point was missed, and the Bears led 44-0.

Lebanon finally got across mid field on their last drive, and got it to first-and-goal. However, the Bears kept fighting and preserved the shutout, stopping Lebanon on four straight plays.
