

Stoney Crouch, a senior at Mt. Juliet High School, earned his way on to the inaugural Tennessee Junior Cup this past weekend held at the Vanderbilt Legends Golf Course. The top 16 boys in the state, based on 2012 year long season play, made the list. It was the East Team vs. West Team with the dividing line being Interstate 65.

PGA Pro Brandt Snedeker was the captain for the West Team and PGA Pro Scott Stallings was the captain for the East Team. Each coached their team in high competitive fashion and treated the boys to a professional golf experience.
