The State of Tennessee recently named 169 schools as Reward Schools, which means they were the top five percent in either annual growth or academic achievement.

Schools got the honor for either growth or achievement, but Lakeview Elementary received it in both. Only 16 schools in the state at all grade levels achieved that honor.

“With everything that is on their shoulders, they are making it work,” said Lakeview Principal Tracey Burge about her teachers and staff.

Lakeview was the only school in Wilson County to receive the Reward School status in both categories. W.A. Wright Elementary, Mt. Juliet High School and Wilson Central High School achieved it in Progress. Stoner Creek Elementary received the honor in performance.

“Everybody goes above and beyond,” said fifth grade Math and Science teacher Stephanie Allen. She said that the staff communicated with each other just about every day during the summer, and it wasn’t just the same grade level. Allen said all teachers work together.
